Winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Autobiography



Join us for a talk and conversation by Hisham Matar, a writer born of Libyan parents in New York City whose memoir, *The Return: Fathers, Sons and the Land in Between*, won the 2017 Pulitzer Prize for Autobiography. In this rare investigation into the disappearance of his dissident father, Matar turns to painting and poetry to guide him in his search and help him explore the dilemma, "What do you do when you cannot leave and cannot return?"
